### Seeking the Common Good

The common good is a powerful ideal and aspiration; we often invoke it, pray for it, and hope to contribute to it. But what do we actually mean by the term - especially in a world that is diverse and complex, with many different communities and identities? In this series of conversations, we will explore different approaches to the common good and discuss how we can strengthen it, even when there is disagreement. We will look too at the ways in which churches and faith perspectives both help and hinder us in finding the common good.

### Wednesday 10 February: What is the Common Good?

With Marietta van der Tol, Alfred Landecker postdoctoral fellow at the Blavatnik School of Government.

Marietta's research explores the relationship between religion, politics and society, especially ideas of tolerance and intolerance in contemporary France, Germany and the Netherlands.

# Wednesday 24 February: The Common Good and Democratic Debate

With Paul Billingham, Associate Professor of Political Theory at Magdalen College

Paul's work examines how we debate our ideas and beliefs in the public square; his current project looks at how the liberal state should engage with citizens who do not share its views or values.

### Wednesday 10 March: Education and the Common Good

With Richard Peers, Subdean of Christ Church Cathedral Richard will share some of the lessons he has learned from his extensive experience in education, within and beyond the Church. He has been Director of Education for the Liverpool diocese and head teacher of a diverse school in London.
