The service is live-streamed, and the central nave area may be visible on camera. To avoid appearing on camera, please sit in the Gallery.

The Revd Canon Dr William Lamb, Vicar, is presiding and the Revd Dr Melanie Marshall, Associate Priest, St Mary Magdalen, Oxford, is preaching.

The Mass Setting is *Missa Ave Maria* by Giovanni Pierluigi da Palestrina (c.1525–1594). The Voluntary Choir is conducted by Peter McMullin. The Organist is James Brown.

CHILDREN AT ST MARY'S

Priest In baptism Maude begins her journey in faith. You speak for them today. Will you care for her, and help her to take her place within the life and worship of Christ's Church?

With the help of God, we will.

THE DECISION

Priest In baptism, God calls us out of darkness into his marvellous light. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him. Therefore I ask:

Priest Do you turn to Christ?

I turn to Christ.

Priest Do you repent of your sins?

I repent of my sins.

Priest Do you renounce evil?

I renounce evil.

He sent his followers to baptize all who turn to him. Now, Father, we ask you to bless this water, that those who are baptized in it may be cleansed in the water of life, and, filled with your Spirit, may they know that they are loved as your children, safe in Christ for ever.

All who seek to follow Christ are invited to receive Holy Communion. When directed by the stewards, please go forward. The priest will place the sacrament into your hands with the words 'the Body of Christ'. You should consume the Host immediately and then you will be offered the Chalice with the words 'the Blood of Christ'. To each you respond 'Amen'. Please do not intinct (dip) the Host in the Chalice. If you need to receive a gluten-free wafer (20 parts per million gluten), please tell the priest at the Nave Altar. To receive a prayer of blessing, please fold your arms across your chest.
